

Carolyn McHugh's Four Layer Desser♥

REPORT OF JANUARY'S MEETING---CAROLYN MCHUGH

The January meeting was held at the home of Bill and Sue Gordon. Our president, Vince Groover introduced a new member to the club, Ed Hazard. November's minutes were approved as written. Activities chairman, Bill Gordon, will be having a meeting with his committee to plan upcoming events and a calendar will be published as soon as possible. Vince suggested that individuals be lined up before an event to write up the report, rather than after the fact.

Under old business, Vince is still the only person to receive notification that he will be assessed personal property tax on his cars, and no one had learned any information that shed new light on the subject, or altered Vince's situation. There was some discussion as to whether there was enough interest in the Trivia quiz to continue. It was agreed that Peggy would continue to make them up for a period of time while the participation was monitored.

Under new business, Vince wanted to appoint Jennifer Ash as membership chairman, but since that is a new position, it isn't covered by the by-laws. That issue led to a discussion about a review of the by-laws, and since Mike Ash was the fish that fell for the bait by mentioning the word "reveiw" he was nominated as the official reveiwer! Mike will review the by-laws and bring back recommendations.

The next meeting will be at our house, the Mchugh's, on Feb 1.


