
Thanks to Tom and Jeanne Lund for their gracious hospitality for our October meeting.

Pam won the raffle. The meeting was adjourned at 9:10.





DRAMATIC PLANS AT ROVER SHOULD SEE A NEW MG on the road as early as autumn next year, and a whole family of roadsters by 1995. The strategy calls for three new models, launched at intervals over the next four years, and would ensure a dramatic re-entry into the sports car market for Britain's biggest car maker. The bare bones of these plans look like this:

- ◆ Autumn '92 MGB V8 limited edition. Powered by Rover's V8, uses modern suspension. Bodywork based on old B, using the British Heritage shell, but extensively re-panelled. Planned run of 1500 units at £25,000 apiece. To debut at the Birmingham Show.
- Late '93 MGD. An all-new, mid-engined 1.4-litre roadster using the K-series, designed to undercut the Mazda MX-5, A series production car, the MGD is entirely designed by Rover and uses no Honda components.
- Late '94 MG V8. A modern interpretation of the V8 roadster theme, using a Rover 800 floorpan. Rear-wheel drive, it's likely to be powered by a bigbore version of an updated V8 motor, feature sophisticated suspension and luxurious cockpit trimmings. The projected price is about £40,000.

Le Concours d'Odometrique October 20, 1991 Results

The day dawned gray and overcast but quickly became a mostly sunny and brisk autumn day. Six cars, carrying 12 intelligent, press-on-regardless rally people arrived at the start. They were rewarded with a clean, accurate rally which meandered through Isle of Wight County from Chuckatuck to the Courthouse and back.

Each rally car got off course at some point having fallen prey to course-following priority number 3, or to the concept of turning "after" a quoted landmark. An instruction requiring the rally car to turn after "Woodland" required a turn onto Woodland road since the quoted sign occured in the foreground, as it were, of the intersection.



After "40" was instruction number 21 which read, simply, R. A quick referral to the General Instructions would have revealed that R means "...a turn to the right of from 10 to 179 degrees." Some cars wandered off looking for an R, or skipped it, and turned left at "Butlers Farm Rd" while looking for L at Butler.


