



DRIVE-DUT & PICNIC, CHIPPOKES STATE PARK on SUNDAY, AUGUST 12th. This is an event designed to enable some of our out-of-town memb

This is an event designed to enable some of our out-of-town members to participate more easily, and to join the newly-formed club in Richmond, the "Central Virginia M.G.Classics Club" for a picnic and some 'get acquainted'. We have reserved a shelter at the State Park for the whole day, but plan to arrive about noon-time and picnic about 2cm to 3cm. The picnic is being datered by The Surry House, (2 pieces of chicken, slaw, potato salad and a selection of peanut-raisin, lemon-chess or occomut pies, per head) so that we don't have to worry about carrying food in T's on a hot day (we hope). This will cost \$5 per person. We plan on supplementing the datered food with a few hot-dogs and some chips'n'dips (paid for by the clubs) so that families bringing children don't have to pay for the children to eat; that way it shouldn't cost more than \$10 per couple. I feel sure there will be plenty of the patered slaw and potato salad and a piece of chicken or two for the children, don't you?

There are pool facilities at the park, and we will have a few organized adult and childrens' games.

* For those members who want to meet us there: from Williamsburg - take ferry, drive into Surry and left onto Rte.12 (south or east) at the flashing light. About a mile or two down rte.10 you'll see a sign to the State Park, which will be a turning to your left.

From Newbort News/Hampton: cross James River bridge on rte.17, turn right to Benn's Church & Smithfield. and take 10 towards Surry; make a right after you see sign to Chippokes Plantation, and if you arrive at the house end, keep on the road to the left to take you up to the recreation area of the park - about a mile or so.
