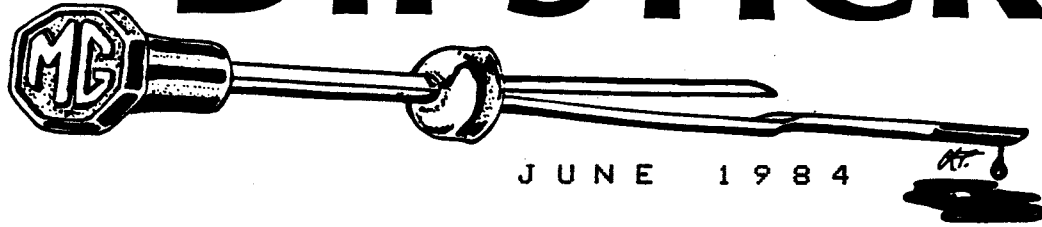

CAR ENTRANT:

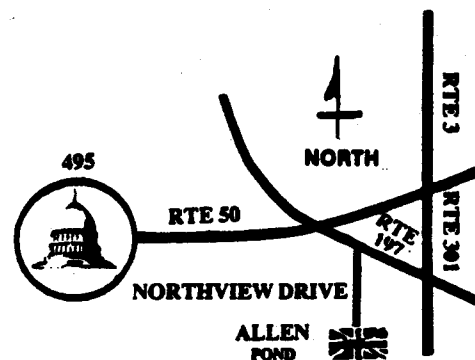
