but she would not be still in the bag and the waitress did look at us funny when it started to move and yip. But a good lunch anyway and then back on the road.






As usual there were the Morgans, Jags, Truimphs, Healey's, and various other British cars. All and all, a fantastic show. Sue had some car issues (cracked oil


