MGC Gathering 2013 in Indianapolis

Hello, fellow MG Tidewater members. We are reporting to you from the 10-13 July 2013 MGC gathering in Indianapolis. We made the trip in leisurely fashion in three days from Williamsburg and 2 and one half days getting home. Our 1969 MGC GT "Primrose" did an amazing job of carrying us completely through the entire mountainous state of West Virginia without any problems at all. Primrose's air conditioning made the trip much more comfortable.

The rain came down heavily on Sunday going thought the WV "Alps". A Chrysler 300 from NY went by us at about 70 going downhill. We saw the car about 5 minutes later after it hydroplaned at the bottom of the hill into the concrete barrier. The emergency vehicles were arriving as we passed.

All of the roads from VA to WV going west were fortunately mostly downhill. We went back through Ohio and northern West Virginia since our MGC does not like five mile uphill climbs a 7%. We spent Monday night in Lexington KY, uneventful.

Tuesday morning we left for Indy arriving at our hotel midday. For some reason we pulled into the hotel the car overheated causing coolant to expand out of the system and out the overflow tank. After hours of cooling down we went in to diagnose the problem. The top radiator had collapsed and the overflow tank was full.

We found a NAPA and bought some coolant, changed the hose with a spare I carried with me and refilled the system. After a test drive, we found the solution to the overheating problem was either the thermal switch or rheostat for the electric fan....more to follow on that.

On Wednesday morning we went into town to replace our liquid refreshments. When we returned to the hotel the temperature gage began to rise and we noticed the electric fan indicator light did not come on. Problem solved...issue with the fan, temperature sensor or relay. I used the manual switch and started the fan, eliminating the fan as the issue.

Thursday started out cool in the morning when we took our cars on a covered bridge tour. We saw 7 bridges in all. One major breakdown occurred when the oil filter gasket leaked out all of the oil on one of the roadsters. A trip back to the hotel to retrieve the tow vehicle and trailer was next. Back at the hotel a new gasket was installed, thanks to one of the MGC Register member who carried some spares. That evening we all ate at the Union Jack Pub that was close to the hotel. Good food and great beer.

Friday morning found us at the Skillman Classic Car Museum in Greenwood IN. Beautiful cars and motorcycles all restored to the highest standards. We had lunch at a great deli in downtown Indy. After lunch we found a C GT in the parking lot with a split upper radiator hose. I gave the owner my last spare hose and all of my remaining antifreeze. Problem solved. That afternoon was a tech session. I gave a tour and explanation of my A/C install, after which I gave Primrose much needed bath.

Saturday we caravanned to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum where we staged our GTs and roadsters for our car show. Voting went quickly and we got on the tour bus to drive around the track. That was our first trip to the track, that place is enormous! After an hour in the museum we had lunch nearby at an Italian restaurant next door to the Dalarra Indy car Factory. Some folks took the factory tour. We did down time and book reading instead.

While we were kicking back in the hospitality suite one of the members mentioned his brake master cylinder was leaking. I gave him my spare rebuild kit to use in an emergency on his way home. The banquet, awards presentation and auction were held Saturday night in the hotel. Primrose did well taking first place in the GT class.

Joyce and I had a great time on our 1800 mile trip; it was a long time in a forty plus year old car, but the A/C sure helped.
