MOSS MOTORFEST 2017

The 2nd Moss Motorfest event was held Saturday, June 3rd at their facility in Petersburg, VA. On Friday, June 2nd, the inaugural British Sports Car Hall Of Fame Induction Ceremony took place, honoring 22 luminaries who have done so much to support British sports cars. Tad Carter led a small contingent of TMGC members who departed from the Southside Friday morning for a drive up to Petersburg. Those members included Al Hazlet, Donald & Rose Ladd, Terry & Susan Bond, and Faith & PJ Peterson. Denise and I were on our way to meet up with the group when my MGB decided it didn't want to make the trip and started coughing and sputtering on I-64. Thankfully, she lasted long enough to get us over on to the Battlefield Blvd exit, safely out of the way of traffic. There were stories to be heard, followed by a Q&A session, and even cake! It was an honor to meet these folks in person, some of whom we have heard about and read about for years. After the event, we headed back to the hotel. Terry & Susan made a beer run, and we



relaxed in the parking lot by our cars. There was even a drone that flew by, and at one time, was hovering over us. Probably streaming live video back to someone's Facebook page. A great way to end another MG day.

TMGC had good representation at the car show, as members Mike & Jennifer Ash, Richard & Sandy Hall, Jack Pavlidas& daughter

Hillary, David Ford & son, Frank &Kiz Worrell, Craig Cummings, and Doug &Eiko Wilson were also there. Sorry if I missed anyone. John Twist did a mini version of his walking tech session, I noticed he stopped at Richard Hall's MGA and Doug Wilson's MGB. TMGCCC June 6, 2017 Meeting Minutes

After a pleasant round of our own "classics on the green" as members parked their cars on the Yoshida's back yard grass, hobnobbed and quaffed, President Robert Perrone called the meeting to order. He welcomed the crowd and thanked our hosts, Bill and Issie Yoshida. (See photo on previous page!) The May meeting minutes were then voted as "approved". Larry Ashton was a guest attendee, coming from the Outer Banks. He has two Bs: a GT and a Roadster, plus he is restoring an MGA. Chuck and Bridgett Alt also were in attendance with their B.

Vice Prez Tad Carter noted that there is not a sponsor home for the July meeting at this time. Normally the July meeting would fall on July 5, but Tad proposed moving the meeting to the twelfth to avoid conflict with the Fourth of July holiday, and suggested we have a picnic. A motion was made and approved to have a picnic meeting on July 12. Tad will update us with details.

Treasurer Jim Villers reported the club has \$1,400.72 in the bank after income and expenses. Historian Susan Bond has scrapbooks and other history information available for perusal, and Membership guru Bill Yoshida reported the club has 119 paid members with 203 cars. Mark Davidoski thanked the contributors for the Spring Tour write-ups, and solicited a writer for the upcoming baseball game.

Activities Director Tad said that six cars made the battlefield tour and attended the British Sports Cars Hall of Fame opening. PJ Peterson took second place in the modified division, while Craig Cummings took second place for his MGBGT. The "Turn Back the Clock" baseball outing will take place on June 27; let Tad know if you need additional tickets. Tad is already looking ahead for the 2018 Barksdale Theatre drive, possibly for Erma Bombeck's "At Wits End", and we'll have a Flash Drive in Oct. or November.

It was announced that the election of Officers will be coming up, and that a triumvirate nominating committee has been formed, consisting of Mark Davidoski, Mike Haag, and Bill Yoshida. Please make your wished known to them if you have a nominee or are interested in holding an office.

President Perrone brought to the assemblage's attention that under the current Bylaws for TMGCCC, the Vice President has no formal responsibilities. The current VP also wears the Activities Director hat, and typically coordinates meetings as well as all the other club activities, although scheduling monthly meetings is not a designated responsibility of either office. Robert proposed that the responsibility for scheduling and arranging for monthly meetings be formally assigned to the Vice President, and stated that this will initially


