In fact, he told us he is a direct descendent of Nathanial Bacon, the leader of the rebellion and from where the home got its name. After a group photo in front of the home, PJ & Faith and Al said goodbye and headed home. We then left for our next stop, the Summerwind Vineyards in Smithfield.

Our last stop at a winery was the perfect way to cap the final day of MG motoring for 2019. Situated in the "suburbs" of Smithfield, the winery was opened one year ago, although the vineyard was planted in 2005. The tasting room was cozy but we managed to all fit around one table. The tasting featured all their estate grown grapes except one and they had quite a selection of styles from such a young winery. Tastings done and wines purchased, we headed back to our cars to witness a full moon and a flock of geese flying overhead. A Kodak moment to be sure.

Here's hoping they have a few more tours in them. Also, to Missy and Bob for taking over the Fall Tour in September. I must say that two towings and a trip to the pokey are a new low. Using that as a scale, an

occasional U-turn seems a little less troublesome.

Our **Holiday Party is slated for December 14**<sup>th</sup> and will be hosted by Faith and PJ at their home in Hampton. This will be a true potluck. If you signed up at the November meeting, great. If not, surprise us. Salads, appetizers, entrees, desserts, wine, beer – whatever. I look forward to seeing you there.


There was no old business.
